Date: July 27, 2015

You requested an opinion regarding whether the Coral Gables PAL is a Sunshine board. In my opinion, it is not.

I have spoken to the Deputy City Attorney for the City of Miami as well as the City Attorney for the City of Homestead and both have informed me that they do not treat their PALs as Sunshine boards. Furthermore, Lt. Barta confirmed that the Miami-Dade County PAL is also not treated as a Sunshine board.

A private organization is only subject to the Sunshine Law when it is (1) created by a public agency, (2) delegated authority to perform some governmental function or (3) plays an integral part in the decision-making process of a public entity (See AGO 07-27). The mission of most PALs, including Coral Gables', is not one that fills either the second or third prong of the analysis.

This opinion is issued pursuant to Sec. 2-201(e)(1) and (8) of the City Code giving the City Attorney's Office the authority to issue opinions and interpretations on behalf of the City.
