RE: Legal Opinion Regarding School and Community Relations Committee Member Serving

as Communications Consultant

Date: March 19, 2019

Whether a Coral Gables advisory board member can serve as a consultant for the City is governed by the Miami-Dade County Ethics Code (hereinafter "County's Ethics Code"), and the City's Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics (hereinafter "City's Ethics Code"). An advisory board member may serve as a City consultant as long as he or she does not contract with any agency or department subject to the regulation, oversight, management, policy-setting or quasijudicial authority of the board on which the person serves. Secs. 2-11.1(c)(3), Miami-Dade County Ethics Code. The City Attorney's Office is authorized to render binding conflict of interest opinions to determine the applicability of the County's and City's Ethics Codes. Sec. 2-300, Coral Gables Ethics Code; 2-11.1(c)(4) Miami-Dade County Ethics Code.

The County's Ethics Code applies to Miami-Dade County personnel but also serves as a minimum standard of ethical conduct for all municipal officials and officers, autonomous personnel, quasi-judicial personnel, advisory personnel, departmental personnel and employees of municipalities in the County insofar as their individual relationships with their own municipal governments are concerned. Sec. 2-11.1(a), Miami-Dade Ethics Code. The County Ethics Code contains a limited exclusion to its general prohibition on advisory personnel transacting business with the City. Under the County's Ethics Code,

[The prohibition] shall not be "construed to prohibit [advisory personnel] from entering into any contract, individually or through a firm, corporation, partnership or business entity in which the board member or any member of his or her immediate family has a controlling financial interest...However [he or she] is prohibited from contracting with any agency or department...subject to the regulation, oversight, management, policy-setting or quasi-judicial authority of the board of which the person is a member." Section 2-11.1(c)(3) Miami-Dade County Ethics Code.

In this case, the individual at issue is a member of the Coral Gables School and Community Relations Committee (hereinafter "SCRC") seeking to become a strategic communications consultant for the City. The consultant would assist with speech writing, public presentations, creating editorial content and the like. The SCRC is an advisory board charged with monitoring the educational landscape of the City and advising the Commission on education and school related matters. The SCRC does not have any regulatory, management or policy-setting oversight over the public affairs or communication strategies of the City. In fact, a distinct board, the Communications Advisory Board, serves that very function. Thus, the exclusion set forth in Section 2-11.1(c)(3) of the County's Ethics Code, does not prohibit an SCRC board member from serving as a strategic communications consultant for the City. This line of reasoning is consistent with CAO 2016-095, wherein a member of the Board of Architects was permitted to bid on a Professional Preservation Architectural Consulting contract issued by the Public Works and Historical Resources and Cultural Arts Departments.

Whether a Coral Gables advisory board member can serve as a consultant for the City is governed by the Miami-Dade County Ethics Code (hereinafter "County's Ethics Code"), and the City's Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics (hereinafter "City's Ethics Code"). An advisory board member may serve as a City consultant as long as he or she does not contract with any agency or department subject to the regulation, oversight, management, policy-setting or quasi-judicial authority of the board on which the person serves. Secs. 2-11.1(c)(3), Miami-Dade County Ethics Code. The City Attorney's Office is authorized to render binding conflict of interest opinions to determine the applicability of the County's and City's Ethics Codes. Sec. 2-300, Coral Gables Ethics Code; 2-11.1(c)(4) Miami-Dade County Ethics Code.

The County's Ethics Code applies to Miami-Dade County personnel but also serves as a minimum standard of ethical conduct for all municipal officials and officers, autonomous personnel, quasijudicial personnel, advisory personnel, departmental personnel and employees of municipalities in the County insofar as their individual relationships with their own municipal governments are concerned.
