RE: Legal Opinion Update Regarding Expansion of Justice Advocate Program and Amendment

of CAO 2017-044

Date: January 23, 2020

Most of you may recall that in August 2017, former City Attorney Craig Leen presented a report regarding the expansion of the Justice Advocate Program. The expansion of the program involved two components for review of each criminal case that is not pursued by the State Attorney's Office. The first component involved evaluating each such case to determine whether additional training for our police personnel would aid in strengthening of all criminal cases. The second component involved evaluating each case for a potential code enforcement citation under Section 38-1 of the City Code.

We have evaluated the expanded program and have found the first component to be effective and will continue to review cases that are not prosecuted to determine if there was an officer error and provide training as needed. The second component, however, has been deemed not to be effective for a number of reasons and is being suspended to focus City resources on more effective techniques.
