RE: Legal Opinion Regarding Negotiations With Lowest Responsive/Responsible Bidder

Date: February 26, 2013

It was good meeting with you, Cindy, and Pamela earlier today. It is my understanding that the City would be negotiating as to price, and would not materially change the scope of work. It is also my understanding that the City is engaging in such price negotiations so that the price does not exceed the funds allocated for this project. Further, the City has an agreement with the United States to have the work conducted.

Section 2-766(1)(1) of the City Code states:

"The city manager may conduct negotiations limited to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder regarding contractual terms and conditions. Said negotiations are permissible only to the extent that they do not materially alter the contemplated contract (scope of work) and are not contrary to the interest of the city or fair treatment of other bidders."

Pursuant to my authority under section 2-201(e)(l) and (e)(8), it is my view that section 2-766(1)(1) expressly permits such negotiations. Here, the City would be negotiating with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder as to price, and would not materially alter the scope of work through those negotiations. The negotiations are obviously in the best interests of the City as they would assist the City in keeping the price within the allocated amount, and would facilitate the City in performing its agreement with the United States. The negotiations are also fair to other bidders as such bidders have already been given a full opportunity to bid regarding the same scope of work (which you have indicated would not be materially altered through the negotiations). It is logical that the lowest bidder would be the one most able to provide the lowest price as to the same general scope of work.
